

Chantal B.P. Mahé (1967) is since 2010 Assistant Professor at the VU University Amsterdam, department of Private Law, and researcher at the VU University Amsterdam Centre for Law and Governance since 2012, her field of research being Comparative Contract Law.

Ms. Mahé who is French-born, studied law at University of Rennes I and Paris I – Panthéon-Sorbonne. After having worked for a law firm in Vietnam, she settled in the Netherlands in 1995. From 1996 until 2009, she had several positions at the University of Utrecht, first as a PhD-researcher at the Department of Private Law (Molengraaff Institute for Private Law) and latterly as Assistant Professor. In 2006, she received a PhD degree for her comparative contract law thesis on the battle of forms issue conducted under the supervision of Prof. E.H. Hondius (*La résolution du conflit de conditions générales, Une étude comparative*, Wolf Legal Publishers: Nijmegen, 2006). She published several articles on various comparative private law issues (see below). Her current research takes a comparative approach to the public/private law divide within the French and Dutch (public) contract law.
